OUR STORY

Founded in 1858, the YMCA of Rock River Valley is one of the region's oldest community organizations, serving more than 48,000 members through programs and services that strengthen the spirit, mind and body. Since the construction of our first modern facility in 1964, the Y has grown immensely. This growth and change has been in line with the ever-changing need of our community. Building on past advances, we have brought the Y's budget from red to black, increased membership retention rates, recruited more volunteers and raised more charitable gifts than anytime in the history of the organization.



WHY NOW?

Over the past five years, the YMCA of Rock River Valley has stabilized finances and reached out across the community to build relationships and partnerships. Highlights include:

- Debt reduced by more than \$2.5 million;
- More than \$1 million in program subsidies, scholarships and fee assistance provided to families in the past year;
- Expansion of before- and after-school care to more than 23 sites, providing care to nearly 1,000 children each and every day;
- Acceptance of a building that will become the Puri Family YMCA, serving Cherry Valley and the surrounding community and making the Y accessible to an anticipated 750 families.
- Development of the Mobile Community Center that brings the Y to schools, neighborhoods and communities, introducing wellness concepts to adults, teens and children;
- Assumed operations of the YMCA Children's Learning Center on Glenwood (previously Rockford Health System Children's Learning Center) to provide quality child care to even more children in our community;
- Established Project 505, a teen program that offers free Y memberships to teens who commit to 4 hours of community service each month. Teens receive mentorship, tutoring and positive recreational activities as a part of the program;
- Developed partnerships with healthcare, educational and social service organizations to make a wide range of services available to our community; and
- Expanded our professional staff to support branches and program staff to strengthen management and resources available community wide.

OUR GOAL

YMCAs enhance community life by offering support for families, enrichment for youth, adults and seniors, and a focus on good health and positive values. Our I.D. Pennock and Northeast Family YMCA branches are in need of updates and repairs to address changing community needs like crime prevention, belonging, safety, and health.

In order to grow, the YMCA will need to raise dollars to repair and remodel buildings, expand service offerings into additional communities and continue to build partnerships.

The first phase of our expansion will include changes at the I.D. Pennock Family YMCA. As the region's oldest and largest YMCA, the I.D. Pennock branch is so much more than a building, but rather a place where community is built and strengthened. As our community focuses on downtown beautification, cultural revitalization, and wide-reaching transformation, we believe that the Y is directly aligned with this vision.

As a charitable organization the Y is seeking the support and commitment of partners who wish to make a substantial investment in the movement to revitalize our city.

To help make the changes necessary to the I.D. Pennock Family YMCA, we are seeking to raise an additional \$5 million. The projects include:

- Pool upgrade. Improve mechanicals, add new slides, windows and pool deck. \$1.2 million total cost.
- Main lobby renovation improving accessibility to the lobby and improving the member experience.
 \$430,000 total cost.
- Updated classrooms on the third floor to accommodate a partner organization (the partner is paying for this portion of the remodel). \$2 million total cost.



- Adventure Center Addition. The space will include a trampoline park, indoor high ropes course, party rooms, a new entrance on the east side of the I.D. Pennock Family YMCA for easy access to the center and the classroom space. \$2.3 million total cost.
- Addition of space for a new partner on the first floor, including renovation of existing fitness center for partner (partner will pay for their portion of remodel), and a new corridor connecting the main lobby to the new fitness center addition. \$1 million total cost to YMCA.
- Renovation of main gymnasium to include new basketball courts and new flooring, skylights to
 improve lighting, reconfiguration of exercise studios and wall climbing area.
 \$1.5 million total cost.
- Upgrade lighting in racquetball courts to LED fixtures, reconfigure two racquetball courts into
 exercise studios (keeping 4 courts) and add windows to exercise studios. \$360,000 total cost.
- New riverview fitness area to increase program space. \$2 million total cost.

Thanks to many generous donors over recent years, the YMCA of Rock River Valley has raised more than \$4 million to help offset the costs of these projects -- including a \$500,000 challenge gift from Rick and Lana Engen to help encourage people and businesses in our community to join them in support of expansion of the YMCA of Rock River Valley. The Engen's have pledged to match up to \$500,000 given by others for these projects.
